During the time on our current campus, God has provided the building in which all our alumni attended, complete with a gym and cafeteria. In 2013, we acquired the buildings that had previously been the Hickory Community Chapel, which added 11 new classrooms (now being used for $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ grades), a chapel/auditorium, and fine arts space. Over the past three years, we have constructed a high school, renovated the old high school space to be permanent $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ grades, and added about 200 paved parking spaces. This summer will be the final major addition to the long-term future planning of HCA, as we renovate the grammar wing to be permanent K-2 space. Much like the $3^{rd} - 5^{th}$ space, this new renovation will create two large classrooms out of three small rooms, giving us the facilities we will need for the long term. God continues to provide exactly what we need, precisely when we need it!

ATHLETIC UPGRADES



Knights Field and The Tate Center

When athletics were first formed at HCA in 2001, we were able to borrow gym and field space from several local churches and the city of Hickory. In the fall of 2006, we had a gym of our own, which served our basketball and volleyball teams through the Class of 2017. In the fall of 2017, we partnered with Transportation Insight and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes to build the Tate Center, an amazing gymnasium and workout facility, where all our varsity home games have been held over the past eight years, with middle school sports still taking place at the school gym. In the fall of 2023, we completed Knights Field, a state of the art artificial turf soccer field. While a significant financial investment, Knights Field does not require regular maintenance and drains water so quickly that we are able to use it on virtually any day, regardless of the weather. To have the best gym and the best field in Hickory for our athletic teams is truly another blessing from the Lord to our school!

From virtually the moment we moved onto our current campus in the fall of 2006, HCA has had a desire to acquire the Neill Clark park property next door to meet our long term growth needs. Of particular interest was the former North State Academy building. Because of its size and school layout design, it was an ideal building for us to use for classroom space as our campus expanded. Many will recall our school renting that building from the city for middle school classes in 2012-2014, and then again during the Covid year of 2020-2021. We were also able to use the soccer fields on that property for much of the past decade for practices and games. At long last, on Dec. 20, 2022, we were blessed to purchase not only the building, but the surrounding 7 acres of the west end of the park, including the upper soccer field and parking lot.

From that point until the fall of 2024, we worked tirelessly to convert a 50 year old building in disrepair into a beautiful new school facility designed to educate over 200 high school students, in addition to creating a state of the art turf soccer field with the Knights logo prominent in the middle. These facilities are a showcase to all who drive by our property, and a source of great academic and spiritual training for today's and tomorrow's Christian youth in the Hickory area.

On October 22, 2024, we officially dedicated this facility to our long time friends, Paul and Wanda Thompson. Over the life of HCA, no one has been more faithful in their support for our school and its mission to our area. Paul was instrumental in helping establish a permanent campus for our school in Hickory after years of borrowing church space. He was also a board chairman and head golf coach back in the day, while Wanda was the champion who created our first school library and promoted reading and good literature in our school.

HCA is proud and excited to now own the Thompson Rhetoric Building as a place of hope for Christian families in the Hickory area who simply want the best training for their children. We welcome any alumni to come and take a tour the next time you are in town!
